## Letter from the Founder



You don't know what you've got until it's gone. It's one of those sayings that I used to toss around without ever letting it sink in. But not anymore. After spending time in orphanages, this saying now penetrates me to the core and makes me sad and grateful. I can't help but think about the loss these children have suffered. No mother, no father, often no grandparents.

How different would my life be, had I not had these key people? Who would I be without them? Who would they be without me? The kids we support grieve the loss of their parents every day. Some say they feel guilty because their mother died in childbirth, and they feel like they killed her. Some wonder aloud what they did to deserve this awful fate. Some are so hurt they can't communicate their pain, and they withdraw or refuse to eat or talk. The loss they have experienced is tragic and incomprehensible. Sometimes my heart feels heavy to know their stories. It's hard to think about the pain and loss they feel.

I like to bring you optimistic, uplifting stories and tell you how well things are going in the orphanages – because they are. But every once in a while, it's important to let you know that behind the beautiful smiles and happy faces, there is an ineffable loss in each child we support. Not one of them is where they are without some trauma or tragedy. Every single one of them has a story of loss, sadness, and grief.

The food, education, clothes, beds, and clean water we provide are important.

These things bring them life, security, and dignity. But it is the stable, loving, nurturing housemothers and social workers who provide the powerful ear of listening and soothing voice of understanding that heals them.

This Mother's Day, be grateful if you have a mom or mom-like figure. Appreciate your grandmother for passing on important lessons about how to love, listen, and care. And consider supporting a (house)mother for orphaned children in honor of the moms in your life, so she can love children the way we all want to be loved.

## Meet Miracle Maker, Amy Brees

I never had any desire to go to India. It just wasn't on my list of places I wanted to travel. But I believe that God put Caroline in my life for a reason. My first Ambassador trip to India with the Miracle Foundation in March of 2010 was one of the best experiences of my life. Now, I've been to India three times and will be taking my fourth trip this

July.

My husband Chip and I met Caroline at a birthday party in 2006. I can still picture our first interaction vividly. Caroline had set up a display with pictures of Indian orphans, so Chip and I went over to check it out. Caroline talked to us about what the Miracle Foundation does and then asked us to become sponsors.

I was skeptical at first, but after talking to Caroline more and more, we agreed. It was obvious that if anyone here in Austin could ensure orphaned children in India all of their rights, it was Caroline. Her passion and commitment to the children was incredible... and contagious!

Over the years, Caroline – who quickly became one of our close friends – kept telling me that I needed to go to India to see the impact of our sponsorship first-hand. I remained unconvinced.

But then, one Wednesday evening a couple of years later, I had Caroline come speak at my church about the work the Miracle Foundation was doing. As she spoke, I was overcome with a very strong feeling that I needed to go.

In March of 2010, I embarked on a trip that would change my life forever. I met a young girl named Alsama, and I instantly fell in love with her. She stole my heart.

The housemothers at Alsama's home worked so hard, and she was a leader and big help to them.

I saw so much love and happiness at the home, even though, to my American eyes, it looked like they had so little. During that first trip to India, I learned so much about happiness. These kids had next to nothing, and yet they were the happiest people I had ever met. They taught me a lot about gratitude. Since that first trip to India, I try to not take anything for granted.

Every time I start to complain about anything, I think back to Alsama and her home. Thinking about her makes my heart feel happy and full and puts everything in perspective.

I can't wait to go to India this July, meet the children at Cornerstone orphanage, and be with the amazing housemothers who make that orphanage a home.
