Dear friends,

Can you believe it is 2016? Where does the time go? It seems like yesterday I was wondering how on earth I was going to truly make a difference for children without parents. Today, 15 years later, those children have YOU! Together, we are bringing life-changing care to the world's orphans, starting in India. We focus on strengthening existing institutions and giving purposeful employment to local people in need of work. We transform institutional orphanages into homes, train displaced women to become cherished mothers and fund scholarships for education. Our goal is to have each orphan become a healthy, happy, income-producing person—and break out of the cycle of poverty. And, it's working!

The miracles we created together in 2015 are too many to list, but here are a few:

- We gave almost 1,000 children the ability to reach their full potential
- \bullet We added 8 more or phanages — full of angels — to our Miracle family
- We began hosting workshops for orphanages that need our help and trainings, but don't meet our rigorous standards for support
- We supported 37 more children entering higher education

I'm in India now, and I'll be here for two months. I'll get to spend time with the children, and I've got a group coming over from the US to visit the kids with me. But mostly, I'm here to launch fundraising in India. I'm here to find dedicated people who want to step into their greatness. I'll need some luck, prayers and some contacts, so if you have any of those, send them my way.



2016 is set to be our best year yet. We're set to take on 8 more homes and support 24 by the end of the year. We're also partnering with the Government of Maharashtra to get to some of the needlest children, and we're helping more orphanages than ever raise their standards of care. Zoe and her son Jordan have traveled with us to India twice: For the first time in March 2015 and again just last month in January 2016. Below are brief journals from mom and son, describing their favorite moments from their recent trip to HMM and Dreamland orphanages.

For the month of January, some schools suspend regular classes and encourage a project or service-based curriculum. In 2016, the Miracle Foundation partnered with Austin's St. Michael's Catholic Academy and arranged for a group of students to travel to India and volunteer at two Miracle Foundation orphanages for several weeks.

Zoe says: "Our trip in January 2016 was my second time taking a group of teens to volunteer at Miracle Foundation orphanages. So many American teens crave the opportunity to be of service, and the teens I've taken to India have all come home feeling fulfilled and confident they made a difference.

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On this recent trip, the girls at HMM orphanage worked side-by-side with American teens, painting and decorating their walls to make them more colorful and child-friendly. What could be a better way to demonstrate global citizenship & comradery?

Before our trip, we bought several used laptops and loaded them with English language learning programs. The kids were so excited when we brought the computers to their home! A group of 5-10 kids would crowd around each laptop, conferring and discussing (as a team) the best answer for every question. This team effort generated results above 90% on each round. Smart kids! We left the computers with the kids and hope they will continue to use them to improve their English."

Jordan says: "In the second half of our trip, we visited Dreamland orphanage, which is so remote that we had to live at the orphanage with the kids. It was great. We even got to dress up in traditional Indian clothes for a ceremony. The kids really liked seeing us immersing ourselves into their culture."

Last year, Bhurelal received career counselling to discuss his academic interests and career goals. When asked what he wanted to study in college, here's what he said:

"I'd like to study social work. Getting a Master's in Social Work will help me learn how to give back to my community and help young children who have no one else."

He says his classes are difficult sometimes, but he is motivated to work hard and learn a lot so he can be a great social worker upon graduation.
